**THE DR. BEAUPRÉ VEIN CLINIC IN OTTAWA  
BECOMES *MEDICART VEIN CLINIC***

**QUEBEC, September 30, 2020** – After joining the Medicart network on October 31, 2018, Dr. Beaupré’s renowned Vein Clinic in Ottawa has now been renamed *Medicart vein clinic*, becoming the second phlebology clinic to carry the name of the new Quebec banner in aesthetic medicine. Since 1989, this benchmark clinic has earned an unparalleled reputation in Ontario for the treatment of venous diseases using echosclerotherapy—an ultrasound-guided injection technique—as well as treatment of varicose veins, spider veins and facial veins using sclerotherapy.

Remaining located at 600-1335 Carling Avenue, the clinic now occupies vast new facilities that have practically doubled in size –to 6100 sq. ft. As a result of this expansion, which began in February 2020, the clinic now boasts three additional treatment rooms. Founder Dr. Lucie Beaupré maintains her role as President and Medical Director of *Medicart vein clinic* and her staff of nine phlebology-trained physicians, ten nurses and one nurse practitioner also remains unchanged. Note that the team will continue to honour all current contracts.

Dr. Beaupré is a leading expert in the field. After graduating in medicine from Université de Montréal, she continued her training in phlebology at École de médecine de Paris and completed a clinical internship in Europe under Dr. Pierre Wallois, then Secretary of the International Union of Phlebology. In 1997, she was the first in Ontario to offer ultrasound-guided sclerotherapy, a treatment that drastically reduces the need for surgical removal of large varicose veins. In 2010, she was the first Ottawa graduate of the American Board of Venous and Lymphatic Medicine. In 2011, Dr. Beaupré was appointed to the Advisory Board and elected Fellow of the Canadian Society of Phlebology in recognition of her outstanding contribution to phlebology.

Throughout her career, Dr. Beaupré has given more than 200 lectures and interviews to raise public awareness about the prevention and treatment of varicose veins. An active member of the Canadian Society of Phlebology and the American College of Phlebology, she has served on the Board of the Canadian Society of Phlebology and took on the role of Vice-President of Education for several years. Dr. Beaupré has treated or supervised the treatment of over 100,000 patients suffering from venous diseases in clinics throughout Canada, the United States and Europe.
